LAKE LOUISE FIRE HALL (LLFH) & LAKE LOUISE MULTI-UNIT RESIDENCE (LLMUR)



Overview

Please be advised that Improvement District No. 9 is starting ground squirrel relocation on the Multi-Unit Residential (LLMUR) project at 100 Hector Road (the old Day Care site next to the Lake Louise Medical Clinic) AND the Lake Louise Fire Hall (LLFH) (located between the Recreation Centre & the Mountaineer on Village Road. This project is being managed by Alberta Infrastructure; however, inquiries and concerns can be sent locally to Improvement District No. 9.

It is the goal of ID9 to complete this vital project with as little nuisance and impact to the community; however, with any project of this scale, you may notice increased noise, construction zones, and traffic changes. ID9 is committed to continuing active communication with residents, stakeholders, and local organizations to mitigate concerns and ensure that the community is informed throughout the process. We will be providing regular updates, such as public announcements, open houses and presentations at Council Meetings, to inform stakeholders of project developments, allowing for a smoother integration of these initiatives into the community.

We apologize for the short notice of this activity. We understand the importance of providing advance notice to our residents and stakeholders and are committed to sharing project updates as soon as information is provided to us.



Timeline & Impacts

Columbia Ground Squirrel Relocation

Columbia ground squirrel relocation activities will occur **between July 28 and July 31, 2026**, between the hours of **8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.**

Residents may notice:

- Small excavation equipment
- Wildlife professionals working within designated work areas
- Temporary fencing or marked work zones
- Light construction noise associated with small equipment

This work is a required environmental protection measure that must be completed before construction activities can proceed.

Activity will occur at both the Lake Louise Fire Hall and Multi-Unit Residential Building sites. Traffic impacts are expected to be minimal.
