



IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT No. 9 IMPACT NOTICE

LAKE LOUISE FIRE HALL (LLFH) & LAKE LOUISE MULTI-UNIT RESIDENCE (LLMUR)



Overview

Please be advised that construction activities are continuing at both the **Lake Louise Fire Hall (LLFH)** and **Lake Louise Multi-Unit Residence (LLMUR)** project sites following the initial site mobilization that began on August 10, 2026.

Over the next two weeks, residents and businesses can expect to see increased activity as crews continue site preparation, surveying and preliminary grading work. This project is being managed by Alberta Infrastructure; however, inquiries and concerns can be sent locally to Improvement District No. 9.

ID9 remains committed to keeping the community informed as work progresses and minimizing disruption to residents, businesses and visitors wherever possible.



Timeline & Impacts

Two-Week Construction Look Ahead

Over the next two weeks, anticipated work includes:

Lake Louise Fire Hall (LLFH) Site

- Continued clearing and grubbing of the site.
- Survey work to establish control points, building locations, property lines and existing utilities.
- Creation of an access point to allow construction equipment to safely enter and exit the site.
- Potential tree removal activities, subject to applicable regulatory timing restrictions and required permit approvals.

Lake Louise Multi-Unit Residence (LLMUR) Site

- Survey work to establish control points, building locations, property lines and existing utilities.
- Rough grading to establish building locations and site access.

What the Community May Notice

During this work, residents and visitors may notice:

- Construction crews, surveyors and equipment operating at both sites.
- Increased construction-related noise and activity.
- Equipment entering and exiting the Fire Hall site as the new access point is established.
- Clearing, grading and other ground-disturbance activities.
- Potential tree removal at the Fire Hall site.

Activity will continue at both project sites throughout this period. Traffic impacts are expected to remain minimal, although motorists and pedestrians are asked to use caution around construction access points and follow any temporary signage or

direction from crews.
